BACKGROUND

Academic excellence, character, engagement, and well-being of students are at the heart of Saskatoon Public Schools' five-year strategic plan. The plan highlights our vision of each student being known, valued, and believed in. It emphasizes Saskatoon Public Schools' commitment to creating learning experiences that inspire all students to reach their potential and the importance of relationships, equity and accountability.

CURRENT STATUS

Pleasant Hill School has engaged students in drumming for the past two years. In fall of 2018, the school decided to embark on an adventure of making their own drum for the drummers and the school. Kathy Eashappie and her husband, Tim Eashappie, Traditional Knowledge Keeper with Saskatoon Public Schools, guided and facilitated the journey of processing a moose hide for the drum.

Julienne Buckle, Vice Principal from Pleasant Hill School will be joined by students and staff who will share their learnings. They will also share how this experience was connected to Indigenous land-based teachings and responded to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action.
