

Attendance Policy

The following interventions are in place to support students in partnership with their parents/guardians.

- Contact will be made daily about an unexcused absence through School Messenger phone system.
- After 5 unexcused absences, the classroom teacher will have a conversation with the student and reach out to parents/guardians.
- After 10 unexcused absences, an administrator, counsellor, or another student advocate will contact home to develop a plan. Support team may meet.
- After 15 unexcused absences, a school administrator will connect for class withdrawal or to reschedule class(es) for the following semester.
